New Riders Meet Challenges

The demand for Turning Point classes has nearly **doubled** this Fall! Parents say their children with challenges need the consistency and the calm horses offer amid the adjustments Covid caused.

The Stillwater schools are sending elementary special education students to Turning Point for the first time and four new evening sessions have been added to address the waiting list.

Younger riders like Lily Belle (top) enjoy games like reining to grab puzzle pieces to reinforce riding skills and keep focused. While returning independent riders like Reece (bottom) are challenged by OSU students like Bayleigh, who gets academic credit in Dr. Jennifer Jones Developmental Disabilities class. Bayleigh is given Reece's goal for the session. She interacts with him to build social skills and then reports on his progress in a session debrief. Each semester, session goals promote independence and skills.
